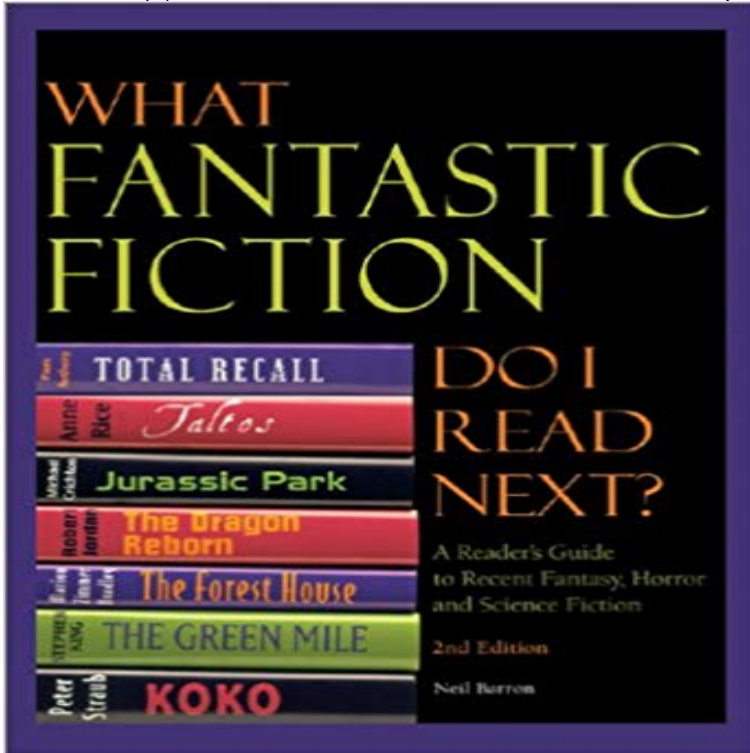


What Fantastic Fiction Do I Read Next? A Readers Guide to Recent Fantasy, Horror and Science Fiction (2nd Edition)
