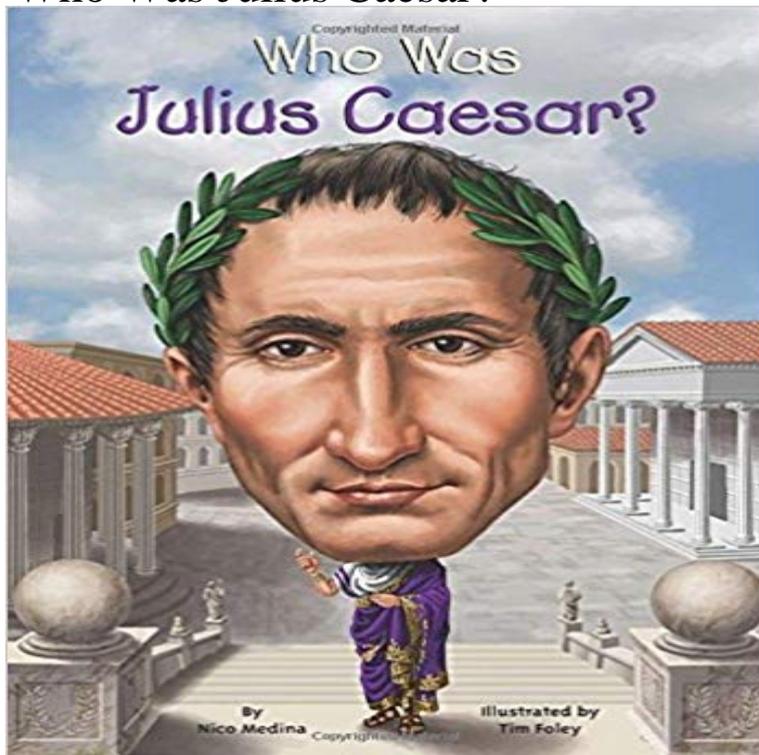


Who Was Julius Caesar?
