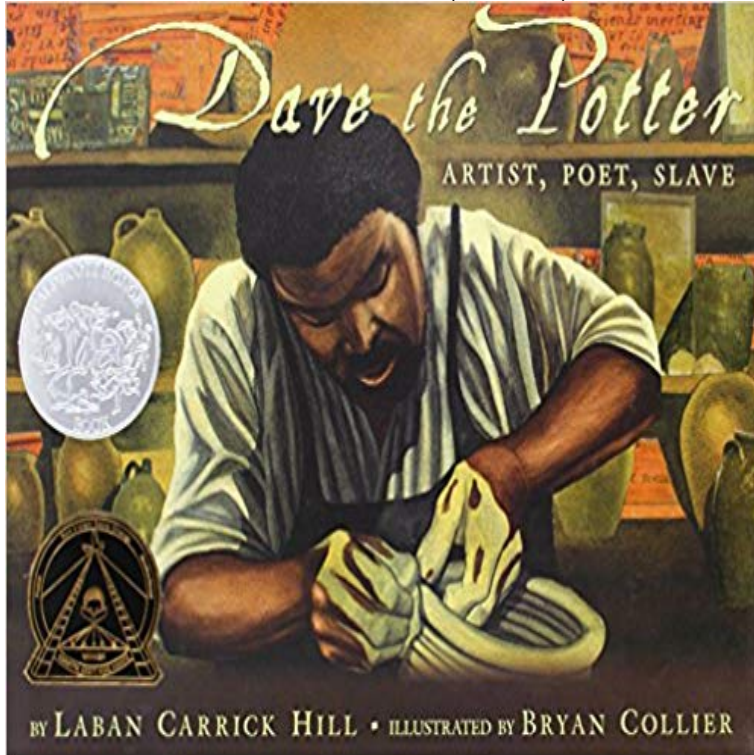


Dave the Potter: Artist, Poet, Slave
