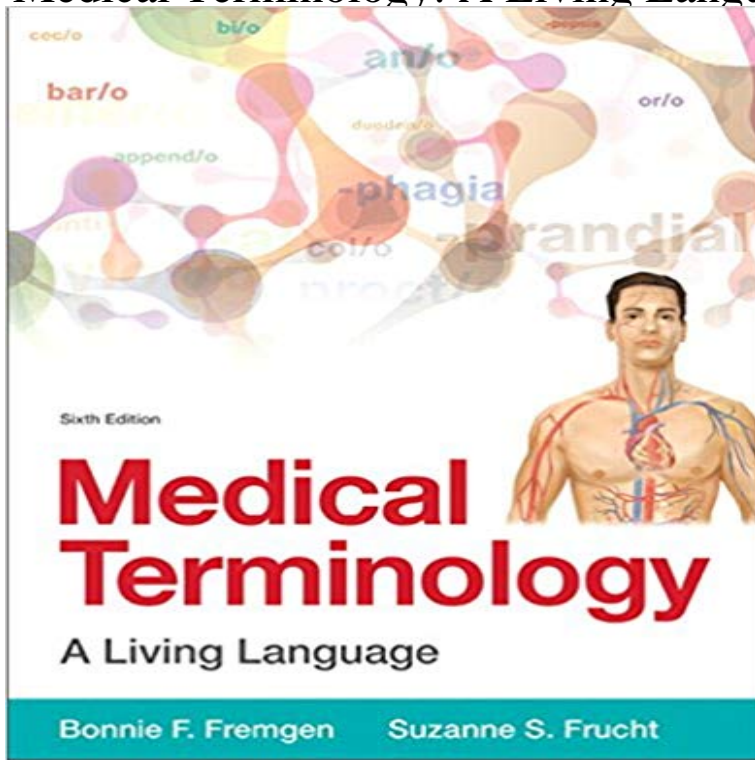


Medical Terminology: A Living Language (6th Edition)
