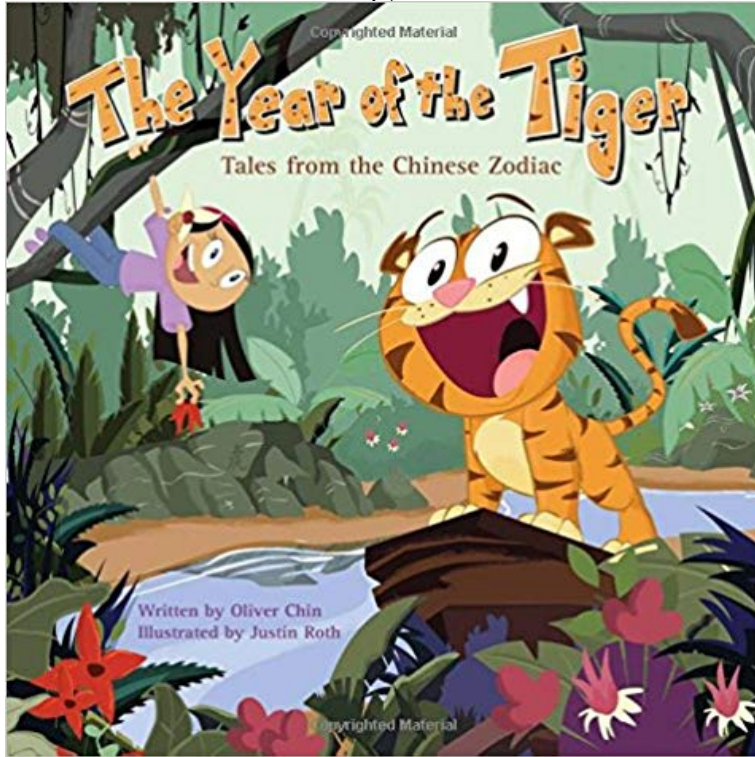


The Year of the Tiger: Tales from the Chinese Zodiac
